Values are principles or standards we consider important.

Values that Affect Environmental Decision Making:

- Environmental (protecting natural resources)
- Scientific (understanding of the natural world)
- Educational (the accumulation, sharing of knowledge)
- Recreational (human leisure activities)
- Ethical / Moral (what is right or wrong)
- Social / Cultural (maintenance of human communities, their values, & their traditions)

A <u>decision-making model</u> is a conceptual model that provides a systematic process for making decisions.

Step 1: Gather information (includes watching news and talking to experts)

Step 2: Consider values

Step 3: Explore consequences (*Listing positive and negative long- and short-term consequences can help you to weigh your values*)

ex) positive short term consequence of building a nature preserve might be a decrease in habitat destruction

Step 4: Make a Decision

Remember: You must gather information, consider values, and explore consequences BEFORE you can make a decision!
